

the **ONCE** and future **Newark** with **Clement Alexander Price**

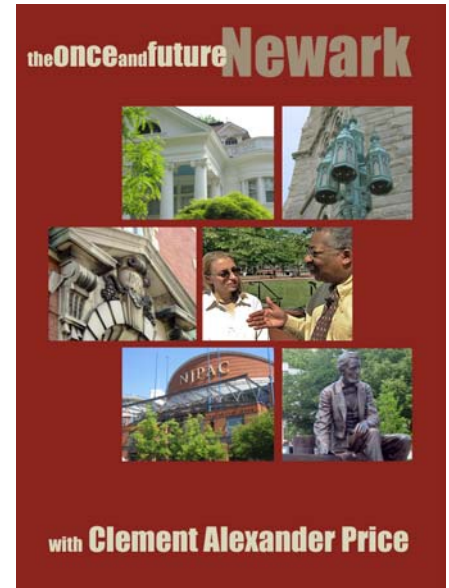
**The acclaimed new documentary film,
The Once and Future Newark,
is now available on DVD.**

Long overshadowed by its close proximity to New York City, the treasures and history of Newark, NJ have remained hidden to many of the citizens of New Jersey and the region. A new documentary film, *The Once and Future Newark*, debuted this fall on New Jersey Network public television. Produced by Rutgers University in Newark, the film features a number of city sites, as a group tour is hosted by Rutgers History Professor Clement Price, a celebrated scholar of Newark and New Jersey history. Part travelogue, part documentary and part history lesson, the film engages viewers' interest for personal exploration and discovery of the city. The locations included in the film were chosen for their broad cultural, social and historical significance. Price's great personal warmth, his affection for the city, and his profound feeling for Newark's fascinating interface of cultures, races and ethnicities, and religions makes this a personal and engaging film. The film's broadcast premiere took place on New Jersey Network in October 2006.

Professor Clement A. Price, Ph.D., is a member of the department of history at Rutgers University in Newark. He has taught urban history, public history, African-American history and the history of New Jersey for over three decades at Rutgers. In 1999 he was named CASE (Council for Advancement and Support of Education) Professor of the Year for New Jersey, and more recently he earned one of the highest faculty honors at the university when he was named Board of Governors Distinguished Service Professor of History.



The latter honor noted Price's dedication "to the ideas of community, and his sustained impact on the development of cultural, civic, educational and academic institutions in the City of Newark and the State of New Jersey." In addition to his teaching, service and research at Rutgers, Price has played leadership roles with many organizations in New Jersey, including the NJ Historical Commission, the NJ State Council on the Arts, The Fund for New Jersey, and the Newark public schools. Price is widely known as the preeminent scholar of Newark's social history, and he is a longtime resident of the city. He is the founder and director of the Institute on Ethnicity, Culture and the Modern Experience, which conducts research and presents innovative public programs on a wide range of topics of concern to New Jersey's citizens.
